Davidson scored four runs on the Marlins in the third inning after a lead-off walk and a hit-by-pitch batter was followed by three singles.

Destin's Cody Moore singled in the second inning, and Kinard singled in the sixth inning for the Marlins' two hits.

In the fifth, Destin managed to load the bases with two outs, but only picked up one run when Drew Pfeiffer was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded.

The Marlins have a record of 5-3 and play their final game at Bruner Middle School in Fort Walton Beach at 3:30 p.m. Wednesday.

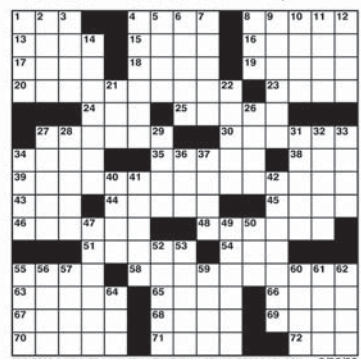
